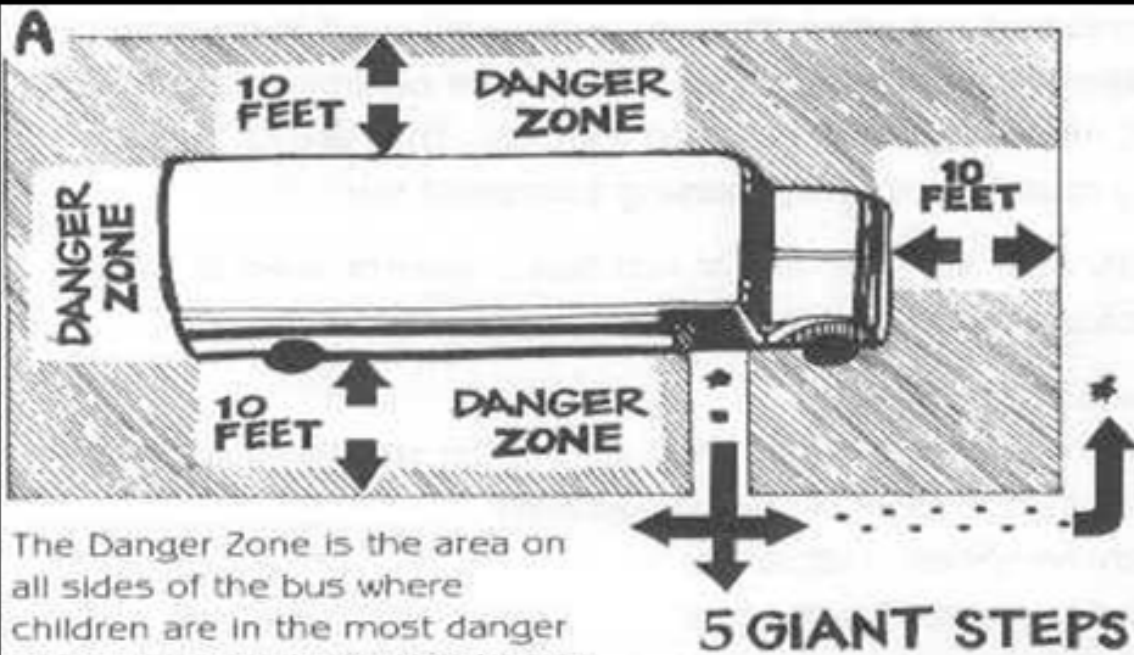


The Danger Zone is the area on all sides of the bus where children are in the most danger of being hit. Children should stay ten feet away from the bus (or as far away as they can) and never go behind it. They should take five giant steps in front of the bus before crossing, so they can be seen by the driver.


1 Two-lane roadway:
All traffic from both directions **MUST STOP**,
when a school bus stops for passengers.




2 Two-lane roadway:
All traffic from both directions **MUST STOP**,
when a school bus stops for passengers.




3 Four-lane roadway without a median separation:
All traffic from both directions **MUST STOP**,
when a school bus stops for passengers.



4 Divided highway of four lanes or more with a median separation:
When school bus stops for passengers,
only traffic following the bus **MUST STOP**.



5 Roadway of four lanes or more with a center turning lane:
When school bus stops for passengers,
only traffic following the bus **MUST STOP**.

SAFETY FEATURES ON THE BUS:

School buses are built to be safe and are considered to be the safest mode of school transportation by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. There are several features of the school bus that help keep students safe on the rides to and from school.

Cross-view mirrors give bus drivers a wider view for motorists in blind spots.

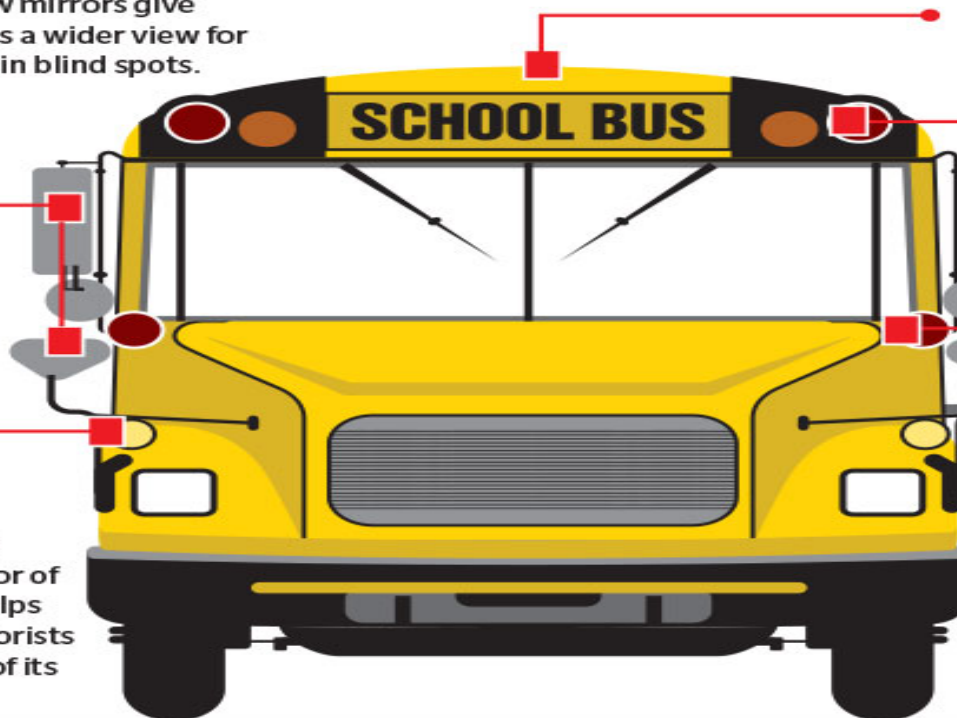
Reinforced sides and high crush standards help reduce the chance of injuries in an accident.

Red lights help draw attention of other drivers to be aware of the school bus.

The bright yellow color of the bus helps other motorists be aware of its location.



Stop-sign arms make drivers more aware when a school bus is stopped for students to board or disembark.

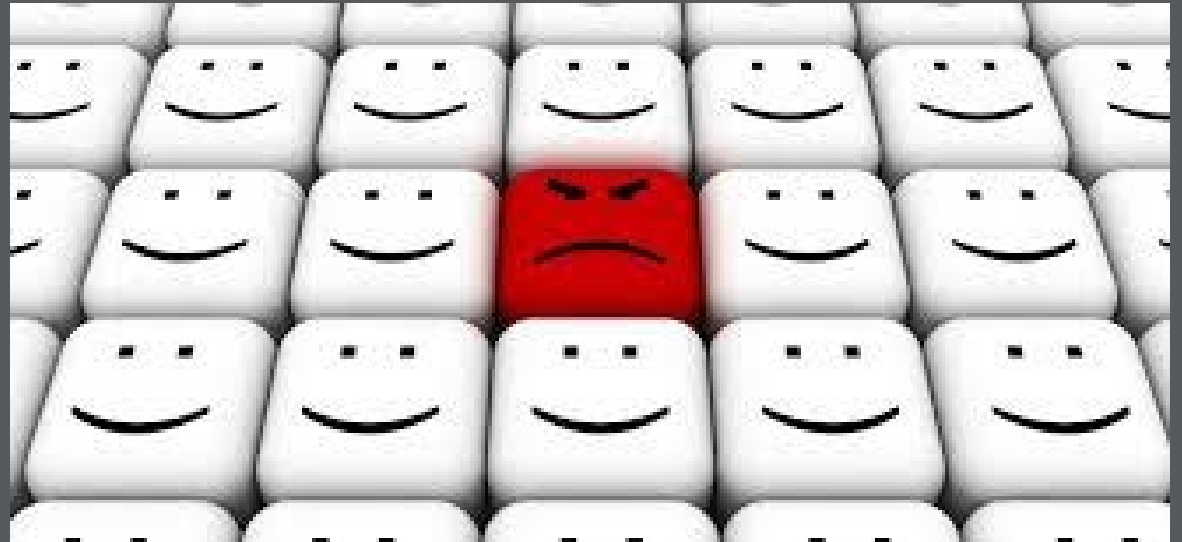
